

- K-12, public, private, homeschool, afterschool, extracurricular, in all 36 counties of Oregon





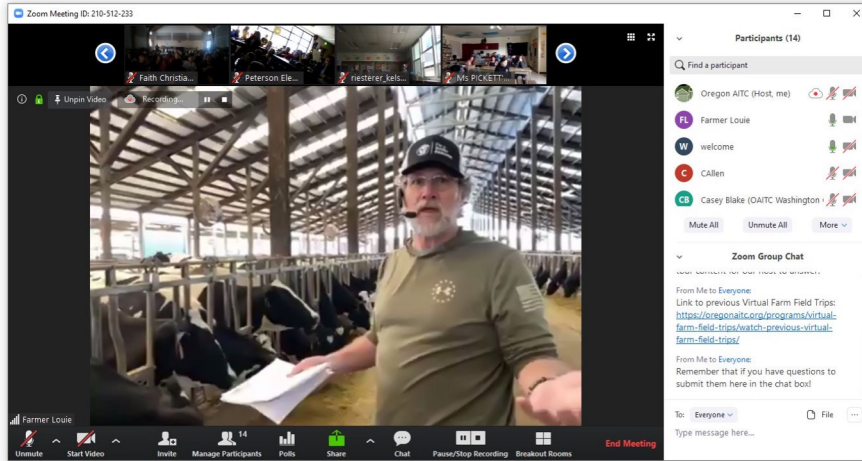
Program Overview

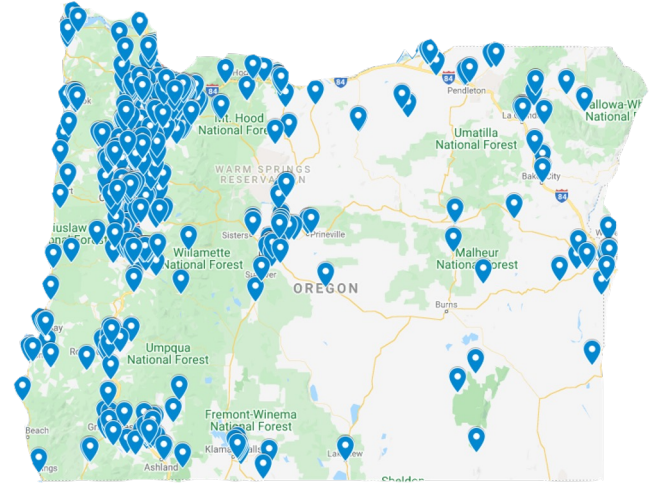

Dairy Ambassador Program

- K-12th Grade Classroom Presentations
 - Milk—The journey from farm to table
 - Dairy Technology Throughout Time
 - Stakeholders in the Dairy Industry
- Events, festivals and fairs
- Participants receive over 50 hours of personal and professional development training
- Young women aged 18-23, connection to the dairy industry



Scholarship Program
